Ordinances

Did you know you know that any outdoor storage can not be in the front yard? Or, that any swimming pool should be completely surrounded by a fence & may need a state building permit to qualify for insurance?

If this is news to you, then you may want to check out the Borough's zoning ordinance on line or talk to John Hendricks. Effective 7/1/12, John Hendricks is the Borough's Code Enforcement Officer as it relates to our zoning and the building codes.

In an effort to increase income without raising taxes, the Borough is considering an Assessment Ordinance. This would require an homeowner to get a permit to put in replacement windows, re-roof, install siding, add a storage building, etc. or other things not covered by the statewide building code and increases the value of the property.

The Assessment Office will be notified of any changes prior to the enactment of this Ordinance and as assessor may be coming out to check properties. Some properties have been changed while other haven't & this will allow all properties to be consistently assessed in the Borough.
