Every property is in a specific "district" and each district has its own requirements/rules. ## Ordinances

Council has been reviewing ordinances and will be updating some of them. The first one is the Assessment Ordinance where the minimum amount requiring a permit has been raised to \$3,000.00. This will be effective in October.

The next ordinance being considered is the current sidewalk ordinance. We are hoping to have some consistency with our current sidewalks and future ones. Feedback is welcome.

The ordinances after are property maintenance & curfew. Even though we are reviewing them, the current ordinances are still in effect.

The Ordinance Book is kept in the Borough Office & is available for review by residents. The revisions are based on feedback from residents so it's important to provide the feedback!
